



The Prototype: These heavyweight baggage-express cars carried express, sealed mail, less-than-carload traffic as well as passengers' luggages. While not always matching the beautiful set of matching locomotives nor streamlined cars, they provided much needed revenues. Consider this: NP in FY 1950 posted about \$6.2 million in ticket sales; \$7.1 million in mail & express revenues. M&E covered over half of NP passenger train revenues. M&E only grows more as we head into the 60's where ticket sales drop. It's the bread and butter for these modern distinctive streamlined passenger trains.
